WHEN ARE POINTS NOT THE POINT?

When a partnership holds two balanced hands, point count is an incredibly accurate predictor of the number of tricks likely to be available.

Distribution is the key:

The value of "togetherness":

There are no more than 3 losers in any one suit.

OPENING BID

Opening bids give the description of the strength of the hand, therefore, the point count is very important.

The average opening bid:

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12 – 14 HCP has 6 – 7 losers
15 – 17 HPC has 5 – 6 losers
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18+ HPC – you are very lucky

Subsequent bidding after a response is made on your loser count and not your point count.

Subsequent bidding with a single suit raise: (1H--2 H) (1S--2S) with a 7 loser hand, you PASS with a 6 loser hand, you INVITE game with a 5 loser hand, GO!

TRIAL BID: Opener has 3 or more with an honor in this suit. Reevaluate your hand knowing that opener has no more than a 6 loser hand. *

Even if your partner is not on the same page as you are, you can improve your game by 20% by using loser count and not by point count

In a competitive auction, you should always bid to the level equal to the combined number of trumps held by your partnership.

If your partner opens with 2S, opponents Double, what do you bid with the following hands?

- 1. BID 4! Vulnerable or not. You have 10 trumps and in a competitive auction, bid to the level of the number of trumps held by your partnership.
- 2. BID 3. Now you have 9 trumps.
- 3. PASS. With 8 trumps you belong in 2S.
